**FREE DOCUMENTARY FILM SHOWING OF ‘70 X 7 THE FORGIVENESS EQUATION’
Monday, June 15, 6:45 p.m. Ross School, East Hampton**

Those who missed the “Hamptons Take Two Film Festival” on November 23 at Bay Street Theatre in Sag Harbor will have a second chance to see a free film showing of “70 x 7 the Forgiveness Equation” on Monday, June 15, at 6:45 p.m. at the Ross School in East Hampton. The viewing takes place in the lecture hall of the Senior Building, located on the left at 9 Goodfriend Drive.

The 36-minute documentary approaches the subject of revenge and forgiveness by recounting two tragic stories involving murder—one about two sisters who lost their elderly parents, and another about a father who lost his daughter in the 1995 Oklahoma City bombing.

“70 x 7,” the film’s title, refers to a biblical passage that asks: how often should forgiveness be given to someone who does you wrong?

The documentary was produced and directed by Jacqui Lofaro of Bridgehampton and Victor Teich of East Hampton, who are partners in Justice Productions, a documentary film company focused on issues of social justice. Their film “70 x 7” is a sequel to the documentary “The Empty Chair: Death Penalty Yes or No” which won the 2006 Thurgood Marshall Broadcast Journalism Award and debuted at the 2003 Hamptons International Film Festival. Ms. Lofaro will be present for a “Q and A” session after the screening. She is a former president of both the League of Women Voters of the Hamptons and the Suffolk County LWV. The Hamptons League is sponsoring the free film showing on June 15.
